Since February 2020 Italy has undergone an extremely severe public health emergency due to the spread of the Covid-19 virus which has seriously hit the population and brought the national health system to it's knees.

Lombardy has been the most affected region in Italy. The area around the city of Bergamo, in particular, still represents one of the zones most tragically affected by the terrible effects of the pandemic.

Lombardy's health services were overwhelmed with a very high number of patients leading to collapse in few weeks.

Doctors and health personnel have worked without pause, being forced to select those patients to treat more urgently. From the very start beds ran out, as did machinery for the intensive and sub-intensive care unit, and health care centers for both patients and health workers, many of whom in their turn have been infected, extending the chain of contagion.

In addition to the health emergency, a **social emergency** broke out too.

The pandemic has seriously jeopardized many people's life, especially those over 65, who represent one the most vulnerable categories at risk.



CESVI'S INTERVENTION









We from Cesvi started out in Bergamo 35 years ago: seeing our land so harshly affected, we immediately set up a fundraising campaign to support the Hospitals of Bergamo and take social action to help the most vulnerable part

of the population: the elderly. Thanks to our experience in managing emergencies in the most difficult and remote situations on the planet, we have acted promptly in the sectors of health, social-assistance and economics.



HEALTH SECTOR

Support to the city's hospitals (Pope John XXIII Hospital, the Alpine Regiment's Field Hospital), aid to the rest homes and the convalescence facilities for discharged



SOCIAL-ASSISTANCE SECTOR

Support to the economically weakest segment of the over 65's from Bergamo and Milan (Municipality VI), through home **delivery services**

Support for helping Bergamo's micro-enterprises to face the expenses incurred under lockdown and the investments needed for recovery through the




Covid patients, run by ATS (the Agency for the Protection of Health) of Bergamo, through the purchase of personal protection supplies and medical equipment.





THE RESPONSE TO THE HEALTH EMERGENCY



We took action from the very start to face up to the Coronavirus Emergency in the health sector supporting the **Pope John XXIII Hospital**, constantly providing the health care centers with urgent supplies and equipment and working in close collaboration and synergy with the hospital staff. We also provided equipment for diagnostics and intensive care in the health care center for the **Alpine Regiment's Field Hospital**. We guaranteed help to ATS by supporting convalescent facilities for discharged Covid patients, through the donation of respirators.

Thanks to the strategic partnership with the **United Nations Humanitarian Response Depot** (UNHRD) in Brindisi, run by WFP, we were able to convert **the sums collected through private donations into certified humanitarian aid**, with guaranteed rapid delivery when the market was particularly disrupted.





RESULTS

Thanks to the solidarity that arose spontaneously, we raised **more than 5 million** euros with which we gave to the Pope John XXIII Hospital in Bergamo and to the Alpini's Field Hospital more than 1 million personal protection equipment sets, a cardio help, a mobile CT scan, 16 ventilators and two sanitizers as well as other urgent medical supplies. Besides that, 500 pulmonary ventilators (400 ventilators and humidifiers purchased by Cesvi and 100 donated by Gestri) have been delivered to ATS (the **Agency for the Protection of Health in Bergamo province**), which have been used in facilities for discharged Covid patients to complete their recovery. Finally, Cesvi provided 748 swabs for epidemiological tests in Bergamo.



THE RESPONSE TO THE ELDERLY EMERGENCY






The population over 65 years old has been the most affected by Covid-19. That's why, from the very start, the authority's guidelines have been addressed mainly to this sector of the population, who have been asked to stay at home as much as possible. Cesvi has offered effective solutions to the most fragile people's needs through professional figures such as social welfare operators, family assistants and social guardians. From the first days of the emergency we activated a network of 22 specialized social-health operators and 540 volunteers, in the territories of Milan and Bergamo, who have provided the over 65's with assistance and health protection services.

It was decided to concentrate the intervention in those zones most at risk for this segment of the population, and in particular: the Municipality VI of Milan City, an area characterized by a high percentage of elderly people (22.4% of the existing population), often in particularly fragile socio-economic conditions, and in Bergamo City and other villages of the Territorial District 1, where the elderly account for the 25% of the overall population.

The group of people I'm working with is very precious too; we discuss and support each other; the team work is really crucial».

THE RESPONSE **TO THE ECONOMIC EMERGENCY**





The halting of small productive enterprises, shops and artisans of Bergamo under lockdown triggered a lasting crisis and the closure of many of these businesses, already in serious trouble before the pandemic due to the economic crisis.

To sustain the recovery of these businesses in need and give new hope to the productivity of the city and its suburbs we have launched, thanks to an extraordinary funding from the Intesa Sanpaolo bank and in collaboration with the Municipality of Bergamo, the "Bergamo Renaissance" Program.

The project foresees the distribution of 10 million euros of non-repayable contributions to cover the expenses that small commercial enterprises have had to bear during lockdown and for adjustment to the new Covid-19 context.

The program consists of four grants: the first "Unavoidable expenditures", to face expenses during the enforced closure. The second and the third ones, respectively, "Michelangelo" and "Raffaello", support projects for adjustment and consolidation of activities, and those for innovation and re-organization of service and product models; the fourth grant, "Artemisia", in place since the end of September, is devoted to consolidation and innovation in non-profit/third sector organizations.

Cesvi is entrusted with the operative management of the project: handling of financing request procedures as well as distribution, monitoring and accounting for non-repayable contributions. The remaining 20 million euros will be distributed as "impact loans" by Intesa Sanpaolo.

Mauro Pezzetti's testimony, owner of the Pastry shop Salvi, Bergamo

«I took over the management of the historical pastry shop Salvi two years ago, taking on the legacy of a land-mark bar in central Bergamo. I am a professional pastry chef, with a past as a professional musician, and this is the first shop in my life. My partner and I fell immediately in love with this venue, and we are putting our hearts and souls into bringing this pastry shop back to its former splendor, and all in all we are getting on well. Unfortunately the Coronavirus has abruptly stopped our work, after a successful Christmas season. During lockdown, from Caravaggio where we live, I sometimes went to the city to check that all the equipment was ok and I found a ghost city, barricaded. Going into the shop, empty and without the typical aromas of cakes and coffee, made me very sad. I was frightened that we would have to put an end to our dream. Nonetheless during the closure we kept ourselves informed about the help that State and Region made available to support enterprises. So we learnt about the Bergamo Renaissance program, and we were impressed that a local Institution like the Municipality and an NGO, together with Intesa Sanpaolo, were there for us. A precious help to cover expenses that would have weighed heavily on the shoulders of our business. We applied and were surprised to receive the funds in less than a week, in record time. We reopened the pastry shop on the 4th of May and the bar on the 18th. Work has opened up again and our customers have proved to be faithful and caring. We are confident that life can gradually return almost to "normal" again, as we see that **Bergamo and its citizens** are reacting positively in this new phase, but we can't hide a touch of fear for the autumn. We are grateful for the help received from Bergamo Renaissance and we hope that it can be an example for central bodiesi».

RESPONSE TO THE EMERGENCY ALL OVER THE WORLD

OVID-19 Response



COVID-19 Respons



In the global COVID-19 pandemic picture, we have activated **all possible channels** to respond effectively to it in those countries where we are working, paying special attention to the contexts in which the Coronavirus's spread could have tragic consequences, worsening living conditions already compromised by hunger, poverty and vulnerability.

SOMALIA

In Somalia, in continuity with the ongoing health intervention, **Cesvi** is distributing **personal protection equipment for front line rescuers** and continues to work in Health Centers. Furthermore, where possible, it works in villages with mobile clinics to **monitor the population's state of health**. Awareness campaigns have been started in health centers, but also in villages and over the radio, on how important **hygiene** and **prevention** are. **Cesvi** is also distributing **hygiene kits for families** and working on reactivating sources of drinking water and on constructing hand washing stations. The most vulnerable families are also being supported with cash transfers aimed at **supporting the local economy**, further damaged by the Coronavirus health emergency.

PALESTINE

In **Palestine** Cesvi is working on the **environmental health** issue to combat the spread of the virus. In particular it has set up a response to the pandemic crisis by ensuring the **proper di**- **sposal of infective sanitary waste** from health facilities, quarantine centers and home isolation, both in Cisgiordania and Gaza.

PAKISTAN

In Pakistan, Cesvi is building latrines, providing water tankers and electric energy generators in quarantine centers. It's delivering thousands of personal protection kits for health workers in hospitals and quarantine centers, and for paramedical staff in various districts, and has started up a **communication and awareness campaign** about the Covid-19 risks, to be sent out in different local languages, **addressed to disadvantaged areas**.

BRAZIL

In Brazil, due to the lockdown, the **House of Smile** has had to temporarily halt its activities dedicated to children and youth. But the operators' work hasn't stopped and some of those activities have been transformed to **support** local **communities**. The staff at the House of smile of **Rio de Janeiro** set up a **home delivery service of food** in the favela of Manguinhos **for families which can't work**. This service has been organized

PERÙ

In Perù a project has been set up to assist single mothers and their children who drop in on the House of smile in Lima, extended to the population of the Capital's suburbs, which have been seriously hit by the Coronavirus. Indeed Cesvi has assisted more than 5,000 vul-

LEBANON

In Lebanon, following the closure of schools and sport centers and the overall lockdown, **Cesvi** has reconverted the activities devoted to childhood adapting them to the new situation. Thus it has been able to **support from a distance the 1,500 refugee Lebanese children** from the Beirut and Mount Lebanon regions, coming from vulnerable families and at risk of dropping out of school, involving them in the "**Resilient EducAction**" project. The involving groups and social movements of the favela and encompasses nearly **200 families** to which 3 months of basic provisions must be guaranteed. Moreover, the operators keep in touch with children and youth enrolled in the House of smile's courses and their families too, also through video-lessons, so as to know their needs in times of emergency.

project is based on sport and artistic leisure activities, aimed at **stimulating their talents and their self-esteem**, and on courses helping them manage their emotions and reinforce social cohesion. **Cesvi**'s staff have never stopped supporting minors in **coping with the stress** caused by the pandemic, offering training and sports activities at a distance, and awareness activities about prevention and response to the virus.





















Cesvi is an Italian secular, independent, humanitarian organization, founded in Bergamo in 1985.

It is present in 22 Countries with 66 foreign offices in all; it works all over the world to transform the humanitarian mission into an opportunity to build long term projects promoting self- development and participation in the beneficiary communities.

It works to ensure food safety and agricultural development, promotes sustainable development and environmental protection and acts for mitigation of the effects of climate change. It defends the life and health of the most vulnerable children in the world through the Houses of Smile, and in Italy it is engaged in a program for prevention and contrast to child abuse and protection and integration of foreign non accompanied minors. It carries out awareness campaigns to encourage everyone, in Italy and in Europe, in particular youth, to be active and responsible citizens, protagonists of a cultural and social change.

In 2019, Cesvi helped almost 1 million people in Africa, the Middle East, Asia, Latin America and Europe, collaborating with 122 local NGO's in 121 projects and investing 88% of its resources directly in the field.

It was the first non profit association to be awarded the Balance Oscar for its transparency by FER-PI (Italian Federation of public Relationships) in 2000, an award won again twice, in 2001 and 2017. It's a member of the European network Alliance-2015, together with other 7 European NGOs, to be even more effective in fighting poverty all over the world and giving a contribution to Sustainable Development Goals.
